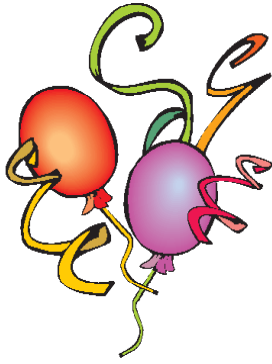

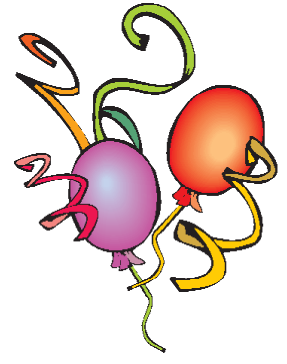
Thank you to everyone who managed to get up to Oakleigh and make the day so enjoyable. We hope we can make next year even bigger and better.
